



GLANMORE NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE COLLECTIONS

Glanmore National Historic Site is dedicated to the documentation, preservation, research, exhibition and interpretation of objects that best serve to illustrate the history of the Belleville region and the lifestyle of Glanmore's original residents. The museum is designated a "Category A" collecting institution by the Government of Canada. Under this designation Glanmore may collect artifacts that are deemed to be of utmost historic and cultural significance to our nation. There are approximately 35,000 to 40,000 objects in Glanmore's collections.

Glanmore National Historic Site accepts artifact donations from the public. Objects under consideration of acceptance into the museum collection must meet criteria established in the museum's Statement of Purpose and Collections Policy. Once donated, an artifact becomes legal property of the museum, to be cared for and protected for future generations. Preview a brief outline of each of our collections using the following links:
