Explore **Lace UP: Canada's Passion for Skating**, a special exhibit visiting from the Canadian Museum of Civilization. Through exploration of artifacts and examination of photographs students will discover the early history of skating, from its original development in the Middle Ages as a way of getting around, to its introduction to North America by early French settlers and its adoption as a national pastime and competition in the Winter Olympics. Explore Glanmore to learn about the elements and principles of design in this exciting visual arts program. During this 2 hour interactive-learning program, students will work together to examine paintings, decorative objects, and features of the historic building to discover elements and principles of design in action. Students will learn about the choices artists make when creating artwork. As part of the program, students will be allowed free time in which to create a sketch inspired by Glanmore.

How to Book Your Visit

- Spaces fill quickly, book early to avoid disappointment.
- Select a program and determine two or three potential dates for your museum visit.
- Call Glanmore at 613-962-2329.

Program Information

- \$3.50 per student (incl. HST). Cash, cheque, Visa or Mastercard payment is due upon arrival.
- Programs are available Tues. to Fri., am/pm, and are approximately 1.5 hours long (unless indicated). Start times are flexible.
- Min. 10 students & max. 40 students/program.
- Booking confirmation & pre-visit information (including curriculum links, vocabulary, suggested activities and rubric) will be forwarded several weeks prior your visit.

Adult Supervisors

- A ratio of one adult supervisor for every five students (1:5) is requested and will be admitted free of charge.

Accessibility

- An accessible entrance enables visitors with mobility difficulties to access the main floor of the historic building.
- Programs may take place on several floors of the museum. With prior notice, programs can be adjusted for delivery on the main level only.
- Washrooms are not fully accessible.
