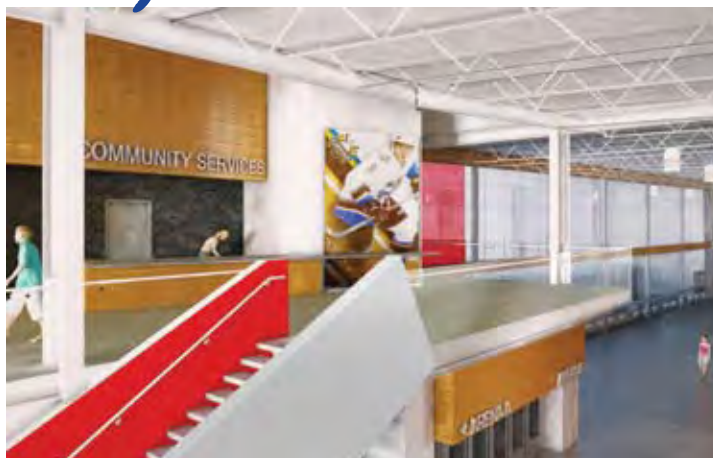

One of Belleville's finest homes, Glanmore was built in 1882-1883 for wealthy banker J.P.C. Phillips (1842-1912) and his wife Harriet Dougall Phillips (1839-1915). Many of Glanmore's rooms have been restored to the 1880s & feature period displays with some original furnishings as well as beautiful objects from the Couldery Collection. In late November and December Glanmore is beautifully decorated with period holiday décor. Location: 257 Bridge Street East, Belleville. Hours: Tuesday to Sunday from 1:00 pm to 4:30 pm. An epic true story set against the backdrop of one of the wildest places on Earth, African Cats captures the real-life love, humor and determination of the majestic kings of the savanna.

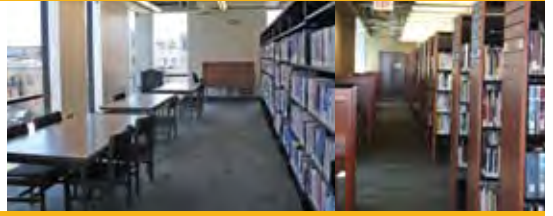
NOVEMBER 19: *Project Nim (2011)*

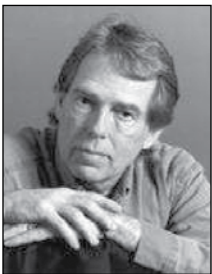
